Updates from LA-COE

RFP3 Awards Announcement

In June, the RESTORE Act Center of Excellence for Louisiana (LA-COE) announced its third round (RFP3) of two-year grants to fund research that directly supports planning and implementation of Louisiana's Coastal Master Plan.

LA-COE is happy to announce that for RFP3 a total of nearly \$4 million has been awarded to 12 grantees with 3 awards supporting graduate students and 9 additional research awards led by Louisiana organizations or universities.

To select the projects, LA-COE coordinated an external peer-review process where three independent subject matter experts, including LA-COE External Review Board members, evaluated each proposal. Representatives from CPRA also evaluated the proposals and helped to determine how well each proposal applied to advancing the Coastal Master Plan work.

LA-COE and CPRA are excited about the start of this next round of research funding that helps address priority information needs and ensure that the State's efforts to restore and protect coastal Louisiana incorporate the best available science.
